
## From our president

## Solidarity with the poor

Caritas Japan provides development and social services as well as humanitarian support inside and outside the country to promote human development programme. It also supports domestic, social work and promotes educational activities regarding HIV/AIDS.

Caritas Japan works not only for emergency relief but also for the elimination of poverty by supporting education, health and human development programme based on respect for human dignity and human rights. To create a society that respects human dignity, we promote solidarity and cooperation with the oppressed to support self-help efforts in order to realize a self-reliant society sharing goals with one another as partners. Caritas Japan supports people regardless of race, gender, religion or politics. We respect traditional and cultural values of local partners who are actively involved in the decision-making process of the projects.

## Lenten Campaign

Answering an appeal by the Pope that the Lenten season be used as an opportunity for intensification of prayer, fasting and almsgiving like Christ who revealed His love to us, Caritas Japan has carried out "Donation of Love" as a Lenten Campaign in Japan's 16 dioceses.

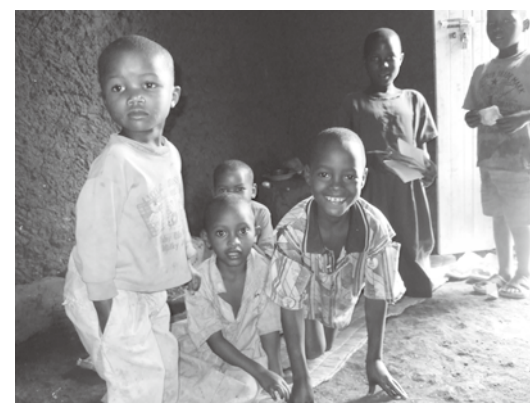
## Aid Activities

### Development Projects

Support for genocide orphans – Rwanda

Caritas Japan is supporting a project of Caritas Rwanda that helps the genocide orphans by providing "home", meals, education and medical expenditure so they will stand on their own legs, overcoming trauma and misfortune.



### Support for grass-roots organizations in Japan

Networking of disabled women -DPI Disabled Women's Network

Caritas Japan supported establishment of a network of disabled women, which is common in foreign countries but had not existed in Japan and had been eagerly desired.
